KEY RESULT AREA: Education
RESOLUTION NUMBER: 2019 – 01
SUBMITTED BY: Minnesota Pork Board
SUBJECT MATTER: Imports

MOTION: The National Pork Board should take steps to inform U.S. pig farmers and engage allied industry partners to advance the Responsible Imports Platform, a science based plan to safely introduce essential feed and products from countries of high risk, in an effort to reduce the risk of Foreign Animal Diseases entry into the U.S.

RATIONALE: The U.S. pork industry relies on the imports of certain vitamins, minerals, and other feed ingredients that pose a risk to the health of the U.S. and North American swine herd when they come from countries with high disease risk.

SUBJECT MATTER: FAD and the North American Swine Herd

MOTION: The National Pork Board should work cooperatively with the National Pork Producers Council, USDA, FDA, and Homeland Security to convene an ongoing dialogue with Canadian and Mexican government,

swine, and health organizations to collaborate and implement practices that would protect the North American Swine Herd from the entry of a Foreign Animal Disease.

MOTION: Be it resolved, the Minnesota Pork Board supports and encourages the Board of Directors of the National Pork Board, within in its scope of authority and responsibilities, focus communication, education, funding, metrics measuring national border security and research activities *(including immediate and urgent formation of African Swine Fever research task force to address committee African Swine Fever focus list)* by all National Pork Board staff, committees of the National Pork Board, governmental agencies, other industry organizations, all vendors to the USA swine industry, and all producers to keep the USA National swine herd free of all Foreign Animal Diseases including and specifically targeting African Swine Fever.
